

WORSHIP

Acolyte *Brian Lorraine (425) 775-7138*

Youth from grades 4-8 assist at Sunday Services and special masses such as funerals. Senior acolytes have the choice of masses to serve. Training is provided, offered in the fall and in the spring. The acolytes are treated to fun activities such as a day at Wild Waves at school year's end.



Acolyte Scheduler *Eileen Niven (425) 778-3122 ext. 223*

Responsible for scheduling acolytes. Schedules are set up for 2-month intervals through the year. Time required is 6-8 hours per schedule. Copies are sent to all acolytes.

Eucharistic Ministers *Sandra Hickey ----Sandra.hickey@ggp.com*

Assist with set up for weekend and special masses, distributing Communion and clean up after mass. Must be a fully initiated Catholic (Baptism, Confirmation, Eucharist and be in good standing), and live a lifestyle consistent with Catholic teachings. If married, the marriage must have been in the Church or have been blessed by the Church. Training is offered twice a year, or as needed. Ministers for the Sunday 9 or 11 AM masses serve about once every 3 weeks.



Ministers for Saturday 5 PM and Sunday 7:30 AM masses usually serve more often. Schedules cover a three-month period.

Eucharistic Homebound Ministers *Eileen Niven (425)778-3122*

Bring prayer, Word and Sacrament to those who cannot attend Mass. Along with this, we bring ourselves, our love, compassion, comfort, understanding, and listening skills. Training is provided.

Eucharistic Hospital Ministers *Eileen Niven (425) 778-3122*

Minister to patients in Steven's Hospital. We offer the Eucharist, as well as comfort and assurance that the Church is present to them during a crisis time of accident or illness. Two people visit the hospital for 1 to 1 1/2 hours each week on Thursday or Friday, usually in the morning. Each **team** of two makes their visit about once a month. Information and training are available. It is not necessary to be a Eucharistic Minister at Sunday mass. Requirement: a concern for the sick and a commitment of one year.

Lay Presiders *James G. Murphy (425) 771-6189*

Volunteers who preside at Communion Services, Prayer Services and Funeral Vigils in absence of a priest. The readings of the day are read, a short homily is given, and the Eucharist is distributed.

Lectors *Laurie Hatch (206) 546-2393*

Read the Scriptures at weekend and daily masses, deliver prayers of petition, and read any announcements. Lectors serve 1-2 times per month. One Reader and one Announcer are needed at each weekend mass. Lectors must be fully initiated Catholics (Baptism, Confirmation and Eucharist, and be in good standing).

Perpetual Adoration *Call Pan Smith or Jeff Baird-Parish Office (425)778-3122*

We are trying to reinstitute 24-hour adoration, which consists of people committing to a specific hour weekly, of prayer before the Blessed Sacrament. Your prayer in this hour could be the most effective volunteer time you spend. Perpetual Adoration is in response to Jesus' lament: "Could you not watch one hour with me?" (Mt 26:40). Pope Paul VI said that the Blessed Sacrament is the "living heart of each of our churches." Choose your hour.



Perpetual Adoration Coordinator *Pan Smith (425) 778-3122*

We need someone to take charge of organizing the schedule and increasing awareness of the benefits of Perpetual Adoration.

Ushers *Maury and Patty Crum (206) 542-8852*

Volunteers greet parishioners coming to mass, help find seating, take up the collection, assist people as needed, and distribute bulletins. With enough people, **teams** alternate months. Pick your mass preference. High school students can get "volunteer service hours" by ushering.

LITURGICAL SUPPORT

Art & Environment *Mike and Sue Venable (206) 542-5318*

Includes assistance in any of the following areas: church enhancement, plant care, decorating for special feasts. Activities include special decorations for Advent, Christmas and Easter. Includes creating wreaths and Nativity scenes, placing and decorating trees, flowers and plants, and using appropriate cloths and banners. Also weekly church plant care.

Seasonal Church Cleaning *Call Parish Office*

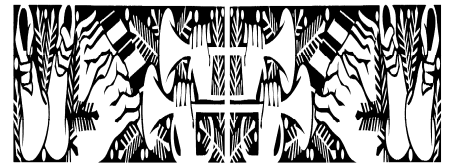

Instrumental *Susan Olmos (425) 778-3122, ext. 248*

Instruments desired are guitar, synthesizer, percussion, violin, viola, cello and string bass. Needed for regular services or special occasions. Rehearsals are every other week for the Contemporary and every week for the Traditional Choirs at 7-9 PM. Special occasions may require extra rehearsals.

Contemporary Choir *Susan Olmos*

Sing at the 11 AM mass each Sunday. Rehearsals are every other Wednesday evening, from 7-9 PM. High school and college ages are welcome to participate.

Traditional Choir *Susan Olmos*

Sing at the 9 AM mass each Sunday. Rehearsals are every week on Thursday evenings 7-9 PM. Need to be at church 1/2 hour before mass each Sunday. Experience desired. Men especially needed.

Concert Production Team *Susan Olmos*

People to help with publicity, tickets and ticket selling, patrons and general organizational needs for the annual concerts that are performed by the Holy Rosary choirs and conducted by Susan Olmos.

HOLY ROSARY AUCTION *Kathy Carr (425) 778-3197*

This year's Auction is scheduled for February 27 and 28, 2009. February 27th is Family Night and the 28th is the dinner and silent auction. Many volunteers are needed to help organize a successful auction, which is the school's largest fundraiser.

Volunteers are needed for each of the following areas and work in teams:

Auction Chairperson *Joan Sobba (425)778-3197*

Oversees the theme of the auction. Heads live auction item procurement, volunteer recruitment and public relations. Confers with Coordinator to guide the direction of the auction. Time commitment is part-time in November and December, becoming full-time in January & February.

Auction Data Management Team

Needed from November through February. Responsibilities include numbering, categorizing and description of the auction items received. Assists in putting together the catalog. Requires organizational skills. Requires the use of Microsoft Word and Auction data software. Prefer someone who can commit to two years.

Silent Auction Procurement Committee

This committee procures items for the silent auction.

Operations Setup Team

Works with Auction chairs regarding best use of hall and gym facilities. This team is responsible for silent auction and live auction items display setup, and assists in hall (silent auction) and gym (dinner & live auction) layout and setup for both days of the auction.

Cleanup Crew

Cleaning up after the Friday evening and Saturday evening auctions and finishes cleanup on Sunday.

Eighth Grade Play *Greg Magyar (425) 778-3197*



Helps to put on the performance by the 8th graders of Holy Rosary School in the fall of each year. Many opportunities include: coordinator, director, costuming, stage production, stage manager, musician, choreographer. The coordinator organizes volunteers and coordinates the date and location of the play. **Coordinator** would begin working 2 months in advance of the performances.

SCRIP Program *Lisa Ibsen (425) 778-3197*

SCRIP is a successful program that purchases gift cards and certificates at a discounted rate from local & national vendors. It then sells these cards and certificates to Holy Rosary families at face value (there is no additional expense). The difference in cost is the profit that Holy Rosary earns to help reduce the cost of Catholic education and it also supports our technology program. SCRIP generates many volunteer opportunities ranging from: sales, order processing, data entry, and inventory management.

Speech *Greg Magyar Call the School (425) 778-3197*

Work with students to prepare for Archdiocesan Speech tournaments and the Holy Rosary Speech Tournament. Good listening skills are needed. Not necessary to have a speech background.

Speech Team *Greg Magyar*

Assisting and editing students' speeches and listening to their work. Coaches needed for 6-8th grades. Meet with students on a regular basis October through February. This is a 10-20 hour time commitment, after school and/or evenings.

Holy Rosary Speech Tournament Coordinators *Greg Magyar*

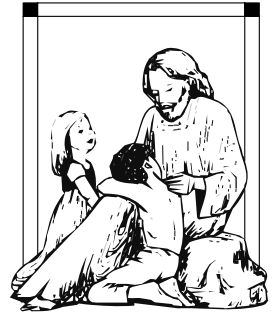
Coordinates all aspects of tournaments including logistics, getting volunteers, set up, working with judges, etc. Needed six weeks before the tournament; 1st-8th Grade on March 4, 2008.

School Tournament Judges *Greg Magyar*

Judge speeches at various tournaments (Blanchet HS in the fall and Seattle Prep HS and Eastside HS in the winter, Holy Rosary in the spring). Tournaments are one-day events. Must be a good listener and be able to give positive, constructive critiques.

FAITH FORMATION

CATECHISTS: *Mary Hupf (425) 778-3122, ext. 249*



Elementary Catechist

Teaches Catholic children who attend grades 1-6 in public schools about our faith. Classes are held on Sunday morning from 10:10-11:20AM. Sessions are held in Holy Rosary School. Training and materials are provided. Preparation for sessions takes about one hour or more per week.

Pre-school Catechist

Teaches children ages 3-5 years old on Sunday mornings during the 9AM mass from late September through April. Training and materials are provided and preparation time of about one hour or more per week is needed. Teams usually teach twice a month.

Pre-school Assistant

Helps the main catechist. Time commitment is the same as the Pre-school catechist.

Pre-school Materials Aide

Assembles needed supplies for the catechists, which may involve cutting, pasting, assembling, copying, etc. Time commitment varies. Most work can be done at home.

Religious Ed Office Assistant

Volunteers are needed on Sunday morning to help assemble materials, prepare copies, address envelopes, etc.

Advent/Lent Intergenerational Program

Adults can assist in the areas of planning, preparation, hospitality, catechists, assistants, set-up arrangements and clean-up.

Bible Study *Anne Wermus (425) 771-2390*



Meets to study & discuss Scripture. Group self facilitates. Materials are provided. Current group meets on Friday mornings twice a month for 1½ hours.

Our couples prayer group meets weekly to learn what the bible says about God in our lives and our marriages. We meet in the School Library, on Monday evenings from 7:00 - 8:30PM for prayer, study, discussion and fellowship with other couples in our parish. Absolutely no previous experience needed!

Inactive Catholics Ministry *Monda Van Hollebeke (425) 774-9777*

Facilitates discussions with people who are exploring returning to the Church. Ordinarily, there are two six-week sessions per year and monthly meetings at other times of the year. Orientation session for training is provided.

SacraMentors *Mark Ibsen (425) 744-6011*

A small group experience, which helps Catholic men to activate God's grace hidden within them. You will discover a way to have healthy relationships through kindness, forgiveness, appreciation and blessing.

Marriage Encounter *Representatives: Bruce and Judy White (425) 771-9003*

Marriage Encounter is for any married couple who desires a richer, fuller marriage. Couples spend a weekend away together where they will experience a series of presentations given by a team of Catholic couples and a Catholic priest. Each presentation will allow you a rare look at yourselves as individuals, your relationship to one another, and to look at your relationship to God and the Church. After the Weekend, couples are encouraged and invited to join monthly gatherings with other couples who have experienced a Marriage Encounter Weekend and share their values of a Christian Marriage. SACRAMENTS

Baptism Preparation Team



We offer two sessions for parents preparing to celebrate the baptism of their child. Each meeting lasts approximately 2 hours. **Team members** are responsible for one of the meeting evenings. Preparation consists of formation, reading materials, and a gathering of the team annually.

Marriage Preparation Team *Fr. Kenneth Haydock (425) 778-3122*

Married couples who meet one on one with engaged couples to help them live the Sacrament of Marriage. **Team members** use a workbook and individualize their meetings with the couple over a series of 4-6 sessions in the volunteer couple's home. Preparation is provided and background reading is required. Couples who have been married at least 5 years are eligible for this ministry.

Adult Confirmation *Fr. Kenneth Haydock*

Adults preparing to celebrate Confirmation.

Adults can assist in hospitality for sessions and a retreat.

RCIA

Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults is the usual process for adults who wish to join the Catholic Church. **Team members** assist with hospitality, facilitating and presentations. Team meetings and materials are provided. **Sponsors** are also needed to be a companion to the person on their faith journey. Time commitments vary with amount of involvement.



Sacramental preparation for Older Children

Provide catechesis for preparing older age children for the reception of sacraments. Sessions are arranged and materials are provided.

Tribunal Advocate *Fr. Kenneth Haydock*

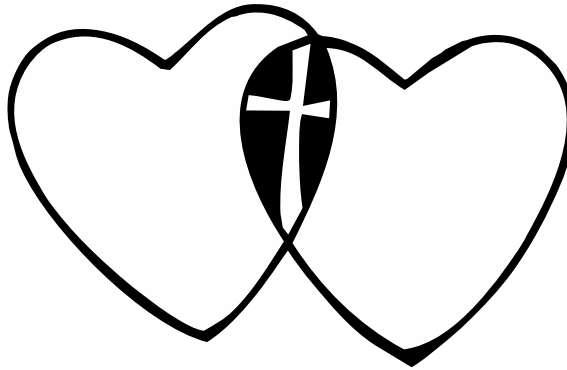
These advocates work with a divorced person in preparing the required paperwork to submit to the Archdiocesan Tribunal for an ecclesiastical decree of nullity (annulment). Training is provided by the Archdiocese twice a year. Time commitment varies. Stipends for doing annulments may be provided.

Wedding Coordinator

Helps run wedding rehearsals and assists on the wedding day. When weddings are scheduled, volunteers are asked if they can assist on that particular weekend. Requires one evening and part of one day for each wedding, usually a Thursday or Friday evening for the rehearsal and a Friday or Saturday wedding. Training is provided.

FAMILY LIFE & SOCIAL OUTREACH



Athletic Association

The vision of the Holy Rosary Parish Athletic Association is to provide all parish youth, regardless of their skill level, with an opportunity to participate in sports. The Association's goal is to ensure that the Holy Rosary athletic environment is positive, educational and grounded in Christian values, and that coaches, parents and players continuously display the concepts of good sportsmanship, teamwork and fair play.

Join a group for Bridge or Pinochle. Pinochle players meet 2nd Monday evening of the month, September through May, in the Parish Office. Bridge is offered for couples and a ladies group and are held once a month, September through early June, in players' homes.

Celebration of Marriage Mass *Fr. Kenneth Haydock*

Each year in the spring we honor the sacrament of marriage with a special mass where couples who wish to, can renew their marriage vows. We especially honor those with significant anniversaries in the current calendar year (25th, 50th, 60th and 65th). We need a volunteer to take charge of the details for the couple recognition (Anniversary plaques, boutonnieres, invitations etc.)

Childcare *Colleen Lemeshko-Parish Office (425) 778-3122*

Caring for children during meetings or masses. Needed for Sunday 9 & 11 AM masses, special events, education series, and emergencies. Many parish events are oriented to parents of families with young children. If childcare is not provided, then these families cannot attend. It is possible that stipends for some events could be provided. Must be over 18, or if an adult is present, a teenager could baby-sit. A background request and as well as reading and signing the "Safe Environment Program Agreement" are required for each volunteer.

Babysitting Coordinator *Colleen Lemeshko*

Responsible for keeping a current list of babysitting volunteers, and calling to secure these volunteers as needed for meetings.

Clothing Bank *Colleen Lemeshko*

Volunteers organize the donated clothes in the Parish Office to be sent to various shelters. 1-2 hours on Mondays sorting and bagging clothes during Parish Office hours.

Volunteer Chore Service for Catholic Community Services

(425) 257-2111

To provide services to low-income elders and functionally disabled adults. Services needed are: rides, light housekeeping, light meal preparation, moving assistance, laundry, shopping, yard work and minor home repairs.

Hours are

flexible, work is simple, and the rewards are life altering.



CYO Youth Athletics

Provides an opportunity for our parish boys and girls to be physically active in a positive Christian learning environment. Volunteers are needed to coach in a variety of sports including soccer, basketball, volleyball, baseball and track. Most teams practice twice a week and league games are held on weekends. Each sport season lasts 10-13 weeks. Coaches are required to attend a one-time, three-hour certification class presented by the Archdiocese, they must fill out an Archdiocesan background request form, and must read & sign a "Safe Environment Program Agreement". The CYO program, while it does encourage sports development, primarily emphasizes the opportunity for youth to develop positive self worth, strong moral character, interpersonal competence and a commitment to caring for others through social, recreational and educational activities.

New Life Group *Eileen Niven (425) 778-3122 ext. 223*

A group of singles, widow/ers, and formerly married individuals of the North Puget Sound. We are a group of single people who gather together in a Catholic community setting, offering mutual support for personal growth. We accomplish these goals through sharing, prayer, service, educational enrichment and social opportunities. **Core team members** are the organizing body for the group. They meet semi-annually to plan activities, etc.

Nursing Home Ministry *Eileen Niven*

Volunteers go to the parish's 2 nursing homes, to pray with the residents, take the Eucharist and be a Christian presence to those living in these homes.

Journey Through Grief with Sr. Jeri Renner, OP

Eileen Niven (425) 778-3122 ext. 223

A group of men and women who come together to watch a series of videos on grief and to share experiences surrounding the loss of a loved one. Meetings are in the early afternoon and last about one and a half hours. The series are held in the fall and spring.

Newcomers Dinner *Call the Parish Office*

A yearly dinner welcoming those new members of the parish who have joined in the past year. A **Coordinator** is needed to organize the **volunteers** in the planning, decorating, set-up, serving, and clean-up of the event. Time requirement varies. The dinner is scheduled each year in the fall.

Senior Moments (55+ group) *Eileen Niven*

Meets monthly for a potluck luncheon on Tuesday, Wednesday or Thursday in the Parish Office. A Mah Jong group meets twice monthly. The Senior Moments Book Club also meets once a month. Theater trips are also offered.

Tags with names and desired Christmas items are placed on the tree. Parishioners take the tags and fulfill someone's Christmas dreams by returning the desired item wrapped and ready for distribution to the local community programs.

Saint Nicholas Breakfast *Knights of Columbus – Jim O'Brien (206) 790-4919*

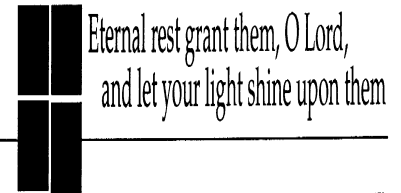
A breakfast with entertainment provided for Holy Rosary families and their children. **Volunteers** help with setup, decoration, service and cleanup. Scheduled in early December each year.

We have several teams of people who help set-up, serve and cleanup for funeral receptions. Each team has a **Team Leader** who coordinates the rest of the **volunteer team** and takes care of getting supplies. The team leader also notifies the **food coordinator** who calls for food dishes to be brought to the reception. The teams will be called in rotation as needed.

Prepare and deliver homemade foods for funeral receptions. Gifts of food are greatly appreciated and consoling to the grieving family. You will be asked to provide food (cold salads, baked goods, etc.) for approximately 10 people. You will be called, on average, every two months or so. You will be asked to deliver the food to the Parish Office and need to pick up your dishes after the reception.

Funeral Witnesses *Colleen Lemeshko*

Be a witness to the passing of a deceased parishioner, or others for whom we provide a funeral, who may not have family or friends to witness their passing. Mourners are notified by phone, and are asked to attend the funeral services.

This is a Catholic lay spiritual organization whose members provide assistance to those in need by delivering food and vouchers for utilities, rent, etc. Much joy is received through fellowship and helping the people we visit. We have a Food Room and are always in need of packaged food for the needy of the community. Watch the bulletin for food needs.

Assist those in need who request rides to mass, doctor's appointments, etc. If we have a **pool of drivers** from which to draw, no one is burdened by these requests. Length of ride and time required vary depending on need. Valid driver's license, insurance and operational vehicle required.

Serra Club *Nancy Crawford – call the Parish Office*

Spearheads vocations awareness in the parish. The goal is "To affirm and foster vocations to the priesthood, sisterhood, brotherhood, diaconate, and lay ministry from among the faithful in the parish, and to affirm those who now serve the parish." This is accomplished through prayer, assisting in twice yearly sign-up for mass offerings for vocations, and helping host the yearly seminarians' dinner, Sisters' Appreciation Dinner and Priests' Appreciation Dinner.
